Reinforced, displaying more hand -washing posters in the room and toilet area. Toilets to be checked, clean twice a day at the end of sessions. Provide more handwash paper tissues. Continue with existing checks for safety and hazards reporting this to the appropriate person. Tables, benches door handles wiped before during scheme, to prevent the possible of spreading.</p> <p>All equipment to be wiped daily with antibacterial spray. Continue to check for damages or loose pieces</p> <p>Encourage children to avoid touching mouth, eyes, and nose, elbow cough while coughing Supporting good tissues practice to children and staff (Catch It Bin It kill It).</p> <p>Temperature check will be done on all staff and children every day while at the club If suspect high temperature from a child parent, will be informed immediately child will be</p>	<p>Yes</p>

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		<p>Mask will available if suspect COVID19 from a Child or a member of staff a temperature thermometer check before children attended or if child start or staff show signs of feeling unwell attending the club each day</p> <p>(staff who unwell will leave the club and isolate as required)</p> <p>A space within the setting will be delegated for children who are unwell (a Member of staff will wear a mask apron and gloves while supervising that child) until parents or medical help arrives.</p> <p>More window and doors open allowing the setting to have more ventilation</p> <p>Asking parents where required. Educate children before they return about the need to stay apart from others and expectations around hygiene.</p> <p>Communicate to parents on the preventative measures being taken post the risk</p> <p>Children will be in bubbles of 5-6 children throughout the session</p>	
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
